# Term 1 Announcements

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## ***1. First days of school***

The first few days of school are an exciting time. As parents, be encouraging and positive so that your child will be able to settle in quickly. One adult will be allowed to remain with the child in the classroom for the first 2 days of school. After that, we advise you to just drop your child off and make a quick and cheerful exit. We assure you that your child is in good hands and should we feel that your child needs you, we will definitely contact you.

## ***2. Preschool Practicum Centre (PPC)***

St. James' Church Kindergarten Preschool Practicum Centre (PPC) receives student teachers from various early childhood educational institutions at different times of the year. Student teachers may be attached to your child's class to observe good teaching practices and issues related to early childhood education. Each class will only have 1 student teacher at any one time, for a duration of between 2 - 8 weeks. These student teachers will have designated mentor supervisors overseeing them and they will take the role of a teacher assistant and interact with the children during their practicum.

- For unsuccessful deductions, a bank charge of \$5.00 applies.

A late payment fee of \$30.00 (inclusive of GST) is levied each week for outstanding fee after 12 January 2018. Receipts will be issued upon successful deduction of term fees paid via Giro / CDA a/c in week 4.

### ***Payment***

Please do not send in large sums of cash through your child whenever a payment has to be made. Should you choose to do so, the school will not be held responsible for any loss.

### ***School Bag & Name Tag***

Children should carry their school bag every day. The children will receive their school bags and iron-on name tags within the first week of school. Letters from the school or notes from the teacher will be inserted in the bag, so please check your child's bag daily. When you receive letters from the Kindergarten which require a reply, we would appreciate a prompt response. If your child's old bag is lost or damaged, please get a replacement at \$15.00 each from the office.

All children are required to have the iron-on name tag on the uniform. Please place an order with the office if you need an extra set of name tags.

## General Information

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### **Daily Temperature-taking**



- Take your child's temperature BEFORE he/she arrives in school.
- Paste sticker (or masking tape) indicating child's temperature on uniform.
- Children with a fever ( $\geq 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) are to be kept at home.
- If your child exhibits other symptoms of illness (a persistent cough, sore throat, vomiting, diarrhoea, blisters on hand, foot or mouth, or any other symptoms), please do not send your child to school.



### **Every Friday is Fruit Day**

To encourage children to adopt healthier food choices, we would like all children to bring some fruit to supplement their meals on Fridays. The fruit should be pre-cut (if necessary) and easy to consume.

# Nursery Curriculum

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Here is an overview of the Nursery Curriculum for Term 1 so that you are aware of what your child is learning and are able to reinforce these concepts through informal ways at home. The emphasis at the Nursery level is also on the development of gross and fine motor skills as well as in laying the foundation for reading readiness.

## I. ENGLISH

The English curriculum has been designed to develop early literacy skills in children so that they start learning to read simple 2-letter and 3-letter words. In the phonics component, the children will learn the letter names (e.g. 'a'), keywords (e.g. ant), letter sounds (e.g. /a/) and shape of the letters (correct letter formation). The letters and sounds to be covered this term are:

- s - as in sun
- a - as in ant
- t - as in tap
- p - as in pen
- i - as in itch
- n - as in nut
- m - as in man
- d - as in dog



The children will also cover the following readers:

- Look at Me!
- Washing the Elephant

# Nursery Curriculum

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Learning how to recite the ABC's does not equip children to recognise letters. Research has shown that children need to learn the letter and the sound through their eyes, ears and muscular movement. Therefore, you can:

- Get your child to make the shape of the letter by drawing it in the air using his/her whole arm, or writing it with his finger on the table. At this age, it is not critical that he/she is able to write the letters beautifully on lined paper using a regular pencil.
- Play a game of 'I SPY' of objects starting with the letter sound he is learning for the week. E.g. "I spy with my eye something that begins with the /a/ sound. (e.g. apple) "
- Read stories to your child to cultivate a life-long love for reading.

## Mini Projects

During the term, we will be embarking on a mini project entitled "Kids on the Move". The children will brainstorm and engage in a variety of activities. This may include games, sensorial experiences etc. conducted in both small and large groups.

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## II. MATHEMATICS

The Mathematics curriculum focuses on 3 main sensory standards this term: colour, shape and size.

- Colour recognition and shades
- Comparing geometric 2D shapes and 3D shapes
- Categorisation by colour, shape, size
- Height
- Length
- Width

## III. CHINESE

The emphasis is on listening, speaking and recognising Chinese characters through meaningful activities. The topics covered this term are:



- **My Body** 我的身体
- **My Family** 我的家庭

The best way to help your child pick up Chinese is to immerse him/her in the language daily. Ideally, you should speak the language and use the language in the daily routines with your child. One way to do this is to introduce the familiar items around the house in Chinese. You can also let your child listen to Chinese songs and rhymes.



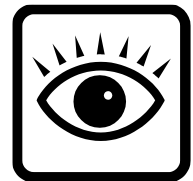
## **IV. MUSIC AND MOVEMENT**

The children will have music and movement sessions based on the “佳美音符” (Jia Mei Yin Fu) programme. Jia Mei Yin Fu’s curricula is based on a SONG STRETCHER™ approach where songs/ chants/ rhymes/ music are ‘s-t-r-e-t-c-h-e-d’ through vocals, body percussions, musical instruments, and movements. Jia Mei Yin Fu is conducted in Mandarin and utilises music & movement as a vehicle for language development and music appreciation. Children will be involved in singing, movements, musical games, body percussions, and appreciation of classical and multicultural songs. Elements of music such as beat, rhythm, dynamics, form and tempo will be embedded into the lessons.

## **V. MATAL**

MATAL is an early childhood programme from Israel. We hope to stretch your child’s creativity through meaningful and enjoyable activities and also to develop his/her critical thinking skills. This term, the children will focus on the BODY - face, hair, teeth, neck, hands, legs, and their functions.

Encourage awareness of each important part of the body through conversations, during bath time, reading related books to the child about the particular body part, etc.





## VI. KEY TO LEARNING VYGOTSKIAN APPROACH

We will continue to use activities from *Key to Learning*, an early childhood programme based on the educational and developmental theories of Vygotsky. The activities will be conducted largely during Learning Centre Activity time and the modules covered include:

|   |                     |   |

|    | Artographics        | Cultivates the essential skills required both for writing and creative artistic expression. Develops “art vision” and introduces different symbolic tools – composition, rhythm and colour.                             |
|    | Construction        | Develops mathematical language and goal directed behavior. Children analyse the structure of objects, plan, articulate their plans and execute them using building blocks.  |
|  | Sensory Mathematics | Develops the ability to analyse the external, visual qualities of objects using sensory standards such as colour, shape and size. It builds the foundation for the development of mental abilities.                     |
|  | Developmental Games | Conducted in large and small groups, it develops children’s productive imagination, symbolic literacy, language and communication skills, flexible thinking, creative problem-solving, self-regulation and self-esteem. |
