Term 1 Announcements

1. First days of school

The first few days of school are an exciting time. As parents, be encouraging and positive so that your child will be able to settle in quickly. If your child is new to the school and needs a familiar adult, one adult is allowed to remain with him/her in the classroom for the first 2 days of school. After that, we advise you to drop your child off and make a quick and cheerful exit. We assure you that your child is in good hands and should we feel that your child needs you, we will definitely contact you.

2. Preschool Practicum Centre (PPC)

St. James' Church Kindergarten Preschool Practicum Centre (PPC) receives student teachers from various early childhood educational institutions at different times of the year. Student teachers may be attached to your child's class to observe good teaching practices and issues related to early childhood education. Each class will have only one student teacher at any one time for between 2 - 8 weeks. These student teachers will have designated mentor supervisors overseeing them and they will take the role of a teacher assistant and interact with the children during their practicum.

3. Extended Lunch Menu

A late payment fee of \$30.00 (inclusive of GST) is levied each week for outstanding fee after 12 January 2018. Receipts will be issued upon successful deduction of term fees paid via Giro / CDA a/c in week 4.

Payment

Please do not send in large sums of cash through your child whenever a payment has to be made. Should you choose to do so, the school will not be held responsible for any loss.

School Bag & Name Tag

Children should carry their school bag every day. New children will receive their school bags and iron-on name tags within the first week of school. Letters from the school or notes from the teacher will be inserted in the bag, so please check your child's bag daily. When you receive letters from the Kindergarten which require a reply, we would appreciate a prompt response. If your child's old bag is lost or damaged, please get a replacement at \$15.00 each from the office.

All children are required to have the iron-on name tag on the uniform. Please place an order with the office if you need an extra set of name tags.

General Information



Daily Temperature-taking

- Take your child's temperature BEFORE he/she arrives in school.
- Paste sticker (or masking tape) indicating child's temperature on uniform.
- Children with a fever ($\geq 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$) are to be kept at home.
- If your child exhibits other symptoms of illness (a persistent cough, sore throat, vomiting, diarrhoea, blisters on hand, foot or mouth, or any other symptoms), please do not send your child to school.



Every Friday is Fruit Day

To encourage children to adopt healthier food choices, we would like all children to bring some fruit to supplement their meals on Fridays. The fruit should be pre-cut (if necessary) and easy to consume.

K1 Curriculum

Here is an overview of the K1 Curriculum for Term 1 so that you are aware of what your child is learning and are able to reinforce these concepts through informal ways at home. The emphasis at K1 would be to help the children adjust to a slightly more structured routine, and to learn to make new friends. There will be a greater emphasis on reading and writing skills and we encourage you to read frequently with and to your child. We have also included some extension activities that you can do with your child this term.

I. ENGLISH

If your child has been with us since Nursery, he/she would have had one year of phonics background. If your child is new and has no phonics background, the teachers will be going through the previous sounds on a regular basis.

Phonics

- Revision of all 26 letter sounds of the alphabet
- short vowel sounds

Readers

- My Breakfast
- They All Ran Away

Mini Projects

The children will embark on a mini project entitled “From Me to We” where they will brainstorm and discuss issues of self and social awareness, interacting within a community, and interpersonal relationships. They will engage in activities related to making friends, working together in small groups and even conflict resolution.

Extension Activities

For each of the letters of the alphabet learned in Term 1, you can fix a fun snack and/or do a fun activity with your child.

- **LETTER SEARCH:** Sit with your child and look for letters in newspapers or magazines. Name the letters. Have him point to any letter he finds and circle them as he finds them.
- **DOUGH LETTERS:** Give your child some play dough. Using rolled dough, encourage him to create a chosen letter. If your child is unfamiliar with the shape of the letter, write the letter for him on a piece of paper.
- **LETTER BASKETS:** When introducing a new letter to your child, set out a basket with a letter card attached to the front. Help your child find items in your home that begin with the sound of the featured letter.

II. MATHEMATICS

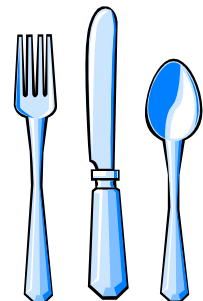
The Mathematics curriculum focuses on these concepts:

- Visual recognition and matching of quantity
- One-to-one correspondence
- Meaning of Mathematical language (as many as, one less than, more than, fewer than, less than, equal number of)
- Measuring length
- Comparing height
- Comparing length

One of the most fundamental Mathematical concepts for this age group is *one-to-one correspondence*. In one-to-one correspondence, the child learns that he must recognise, say and think one word for each object. This concept also forces a child not to just rattle off numbers but instead concentrate and focus to match one word with one object. Children who do not know the one-to-one correspondence concept will say words faster or slower. In this process, they may skip or may recount an object.

Examples of one-to-one correspondence include:

- one spoon to one fork
- one sock to one foot
- one foot to one shoe
- one hat to one head

You can help your child to be aware of his environment using the one-to-one concept. Other ways of reinforcing the rest of the concepts are through an assortment of things around the house (e.g. child-safe utensils, laundry, toys). You can encourage your child to match or sort the items by using the concepts taught during the term.

Extension Activities

- **COUNTING:** Let your child make necklaces with Froot Loops (or something similar) and count the Froot Loops as he eats them.
- **ONE-TO-ONE CORRESPONDENCE:** Have your child choose one cheese slice for each cracker he has. At the supermarket, have your child pick out how many fruit you will need for everyone in the family to have a fruit each.

III. MATAL

MATAL is an early childhood programme from Israel. We hope to stretch your child's creativity through meaningful and enjoyable activities and also to develop his/her critical thinking skills.

This term, they will observe the world around us and look at some of the properties of objects:

- colour
- opaque/transparent



Extension Activities

Identify some of the colours in nature. Get your child to notice the various shades and hues of colours. Discuss how the colour makes you/your child feel. Take photographs of objects with different colours and sort them accordingly. You may want to make a little journal/collage with the information collected.

III. CHINESE

The emphasis is on listening, speaking and recognising Chinese characters through meaningful activities. We do hope that you will encourage your child to speak more Mandarin at home as this will help him/her gain more confidence in the subject. The topics covered this term are:

- **Things I can do** 我可以做...
- **I love my family** 我爱我家

Extension Activities

Spend a day doing an activity with the whole family, be it a trip to the beach, the park, or the supermarket. Take photographs of the outing and let your child bring the photographs for Show-and-Tell.

IV. MUSIC AND MOVEMENT



The children will have music and movement sessions based on the “佳美音符” (Jia Mei Yin Fu) programme. Jia Mei Yin Fu’s curricula is based on a SONG STRETCHER™ approach where songs/ chants/ rhymes/ music are ‘s-t-r-e-t-c-h-e-d’ through vocals, body percussion, instrument play, and movement. Jia Mei Yin Fu is conducted in Mandarin and utilises music & movement as a vehicle for language development and music appreciation. Children will be involved in singing, movement, musical games, body percussion and appreciation of classical and multicultural songs. Elements of music such as beat, rhythm, dynamics, form and tempo will be embedded into the lessons.

VI. KEY TO LEARNING VYGOTSKIAN APPROACH

(www.keytolearning.com)

We will continue to use activities from *Key to Learning*, an early childhood programme based on the educational and developmental theories of Vygotsky. The modules covered are:

	Construction	Develops mathematical language and goal directed behavior. Children analyse the structure of objects, plan, articulate their plans and execute them using building blocks.
	Story Grammar	This module follows a specific set of procedures (Visual-Spatial Modelling) for helping young children develop a love of story, ownership of story language and a profound understanding of story structure.
