Term 1 Announcements

1. First days of school

The first few days of school are an exciting time. As parents, be encouraging and positive so that your child will be able to settle in quickly. If your child is new to the school and needs a familiar adult, one adult is allowed to remain with him/her in the classroom for the first 2 days of school. After that, we advise you to drop your child off and make a quick and cheerful exit. We assure you that your child is in good hands and should we feel that your child needs you, we will definitely contact you.

2. Preschool Practicum Centre (PPC)

St. James' Church Kindergarten Preschool Practicum Centre (PPC) receives student teachers from various early childhood educational institutions at different times of the year. Student teachers may be attached to your child's class to observe good teaching practices and issues related to early childhood education. Each class will have only one student teacher at any one time for between 2 - 8 weeks. These student teachers will have designated mentor supervisors overseeing them and they will take the role of a teacher assistant and interact with the children during their practicum.

3. Extended Lunch Menu

Payment

Please do not send in large sums of cash through your child whenever a payment has to be made. Should you choose to do so, the school will not be held responsible for any loss.

School Bag & Name Tag

Children should carry their school bag every day. New children will receive their school bags and iron-on name tags within the first week of school. Letters from the school or notes from the teacher will be inserted in the bag, so please check your child's bag daily. When you receive letters from the Kindergarten which require a reply, we would appreciate a prompt response. If your child's old bag is lost or damaged, please get a replacement at \$15.00 each from the office.

All children are required to have the iron-on name tag on the uniform. Please place an order with the office if you need an extra set of name tags.

General Information



Daily Temperature-taking

- Take your child's temperature BEFORE he/she arrives in school.
- Paste sticker (or masking tape) indicating child's temperature on uniform.
- Children with a fever ($\geq 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$) are to be kept at home.
- If your child exhibits other symptoms of illness (a persistent cough, sore throat, vomiting, diarrhoea, blisters on hand, foot or mouth, or any other symptoms), please do not send your child to school.



Every Friday is Fruit Day

K2 Curriculum

Here is an overview of the K2 Curriculum for Term 1 so that you are aware of what your child is learning and are able to reinforce these concepts through informal ways at home. The emphasis at K2 would be to prepare our children to be emotionally, socially and academically ready for Primary One. We have also included some extension activities that you can do with your child this term.

I. ENGLISH

By now, your child should be able to read and identify letters of the alphabet, and write these out from memory and hopefully in the correct sequence!

If your child has been with us since Nursery, he/she would have had two years of phonics background. This would mean that your child would be able to read simple words by sounding out the letters. Even if your child is new or has no phonics background, he/she would be able to catch up as we go through the previous sounds on a regular basis.

Phonics

- 21 consonants
- 5 short vowel sounds
- 5 long vowel sounds
- ck, ff, ll, ss, zz, tt
- ch, sh, th, ng – digraphs
- ar, or, ur
- ar, or, ur
- oi, ow

Readers

- Answer The Phone, Fiona!
- Stop The Car!

Creative Writing

Your child will be introduced to simple creative writing exercises, based on children's literature and the readers covered within the term. We would encourage you to allow your child to practice as much phonetic spelling as possible, as it will help with his/her writing skills throughout the year.

Mini Projects

During the term, we will also be embarking on a mini project entitled "From Me to We". The children will brainstorm and discuss issues pertaining to self and social awareness, interacting within a community and interpersonal relationships. They will work on integrated activities focusing on the topic.

Extension Activities

Make a trip to a nearby shopping mall. Shop for things with the alphabet, e.g. alphabet pasta, alphabet blocks, etc. Use them to form 3-letter words that follow the phonics rules (consonant-vowel-consonant e.g. bat, pet, got). Do encourage your child to say the sounds of the letters and identify the beginning, medial and ending sounds. You may also use alphabet cards to play around with different 3-letter words. Make a word list of all the possible words your child can come up with!

II. MATHEMATICS



- Seriation by increasing and decreasing size
- Ordinal numbers
- Number composition 1-10 (basic number bonds)
- Mathematical language (small, medium, large, equal, not equal, less than, greater than)
- Mathematical symbols
- Constructing Math equations
- Using visual models to represent number relationships
- Mathematical symbols ($=$, \neq , $<$, $>$)

Extension Activities

Measure different objects you can find at home. Record the length and weight of these objects using simple non-standard instruments such as pencils, erasers, paperclips, etc. and make comparisons. Identify the longest/shortest object and the heaviest/lightest object.

Have a 'race' with some toy cars or any other possible materials and identify the positions of each object in relation to ordinal numbers e.g. 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th.

III. CHINESE

The emphasis is on listening, speaking and recognising Chinese characters through meaningful activities. We do hope that you will encourage your child to speak more Mandarin at home as this will help him/her gain more confidence in the language.

The topics covered this term are:

- 单元名称一. 《健康的身体》

IV. MUSIC AND MOVEMENT

The children will have music and movement sessions based on the “佳美音符” (Jia Mei Yin Fu) programme. Jia Mei Yin Fu’s curricula is based on a SONG STRETCHER™ approach where songs/chants/ rhymes/music are ‘s-t-r-e-t-c-h-e-d’ through vocals, body percussion, instrument play, and movement. Jia Mei Yin Fu is conducted in Mandarin and utilises music and movement as a vehicle for language development and music appreciation. Children will be involved in singing, movement, musical games, body percussion and appreciation of classical and multicultural songs. Elements of music such as beat, rhythm, dynamics, form and tempo are embedded in the lessons.

V. *MATAL*

MATAL is an early childhood programme from Israel. We hope to stretch your child's creativity through meaningful and enjoyable activities and also to develop his/her critical thinking skills.

This term, the children will look at linear shapes:

- straight lines
- curved lines
- angular lines



Extension Activities




Take a walk in a park or garden. Identify the straight and curved lines in the nature around us. Take photographs of the objects with different lines and sort them accordingly. You may want to make a little nature journal with the information collected.

VI. KEY TO LEARNING VYGOTSKIAN APPROACH

(www.keytolearning.com)

We will continue to use activities from *Key to Learning*, an early childhood programme based on the educational and developmental theories of Vygotsky. The modules covered are:

	Construction	Develops mathematical language and goal directed behavior. Children analyse the structure of objects, plan, articulate their plans and execute them using building blocks.
	Logic	The Logic programme helps children develop the ability to analyse objects and events, see their "invisible" sides, identify their most essential characteristics', think sequentially, draw conclusions, classify and systematize information.
	Story Grammar	This module follows a specific set of procedures (Visual-Spatial Modelling) for helping young children develop a love of story, ownership of story language and a profound understanding of story structure.
